<p>Adult Support & Protection (Scotland) Act 2007 came into force in October 2008.</p> <p>The Act identifies local councils as lead agencies in relation to the investigation of all referrals of alleged cases of harm.</p> <p>There is a requirement for specified public bodies to co-operate with the council in meeting their statutory requirements. These public bodies include: Health: Police: Care Commission</p>	Blue	
<p>Multi –agency Training events are scheduled on a rolling programme with health staff attending.</p>	Amber	<p>NHS Lanarkshire was allocated £20k to support the implementation of the Act. Each council received £10k with the agreement that Health staff would access the multi agency training.</p> <p>Original training was focused on level 3 and 32 NHS staff/managers have participated in this training.</p> <p>Level 2 training is where the majority of health staff will require to access training.</p> <p>367 NHS staff were trained during October - November 08 with a further 321 staff receiving training from November 08 until April 10.</p> <p>Approximate figures would suggest 687 staff have been in receipt of multi agency training.</p> <p>NHSL has identified two trainers that will provide single agency training to staff on a</p>

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		rolling programme. A robust system is currently being developed and will be held on EMPOWER to provide up to date information/statistics around the delivery of training.
Both NLC and SLC have established Adult Support & Protection Committees with independent chairs. NHS Lanarkshire has membership on both committees.	Blue	A challenge to NHSL is to maintain participation on two committees across Lanarkshire.
Medical examination	Amber	Discussion ongoing with Associate Medical Director of Primary Care regarding guidance in identifying appropriate individuals to carry out medical examinations.
Both Adult Support & Protection Committees have established working groups that aim to cover developments required to support developments.	Amber	Health chair several of the sub groups and provide lead representation on all sub groups across both North & South Lanarkshire ASP Committees. Sub groups established are: North <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Training • Public Awareness • Monitoring & reporting South <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Standards & Procedures • Communication & Training • Performance Management
National Audit Self evaluation of Adult Support & protection activity	Amber	NHSL is participating in self evaluation audit within both local authorities with partner agencies (Social work, Health Police). There is a wide agreement that the interagency partnerships that work to protect and support adults at risk of harm should be able to demonstrate that they are delivering outcomes efficiently. This self evaluation framework for adult

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		<p>support protection activity is based on the European Foundation of Quality Management System. This framework has been widely applied across principal agencies involved in child and adult protection work.</p> <p>Confirmation has been received from Harpreet Kohli stating that the audit can proceed from a Health Perspective.</p> <p>15 cases identified and audit is planned to take place on 17th & 18th August 2010.</p>
Standards & Procedures	Blue	NHS Lanarkshire ASP Guidance and Operational procedures (2 nd Draft) are completed and are held on Firstport.
Adult Support & Protection messaging	Amber	<p>The adult support & protection message alerts are embedded in and support the NHS Lanarkshire Adult Support & Protection Guidance and Operational procedures and inter agency procedures.</p> <p>The messages will be generated and viewed on the North and South Lanarkshire social work systems and viewed by the multi agency store by Strathclyde Police Family Units, NHSL PIMS users in the community and some NHSL Acute areas via PMS</p> <p>Training similar to Child Protection messaging is still to be undertaken with health staff across</p>
