<p>Heat Target for SABs T11.KPM1</p>	<p>Green</p>	<p>A HEAT target of a 35% reduction by March 2010 was set for NHS Lanarkshire, with a further 15% reduction by March 2011.</p> <p>The HPS quarterly report on the surveillance of <i>Staphylococcus aureus</i> bacteraemias published on 7th July showed that Lanarkshire had 164 <i>S.aureus</i> bacteraemias in the previous 12 months against a HEAT target of 167. For the most recent quarter (Jan 10 – March 2010) the reported SAB rate was 0.271 episodes / 1000 AOBs (compared with 0.378 for NHS Scotland as a whole).</p> <p>For MRSA bacteraemia the rate was 0.099 episodes / 1000 AOBs (vs. 0.088 for NHS Scotland) and for MSSA bacteraemia the rate was 0.172 cases / 1000 AOBs (compared with 0.290 for NHS Scotland).</p>
<p>C Diff T11.KPM2</p>	<p>Green</p>	<p>Revision of Clostridium difficile HEAT Target for 2011 in May 2010 now gives NHS Lanarkshire a HEAT Target to reduce rate of Clostridium difficile infection in over 65 years old by at least 50% by 2011 (Target rate 1.00/1000 AOBs > 65 years old).</p> <p>The HPS report published on 7th July quotes that Lanarkshire shows a slight decrease in the rate for the most recent quarter up to March 2010 compared to the previous (Q4, 2009). This occurred for the rate for over 65 / 1000 AOBs for over 65s / 100000 population and for the 15-64 years old / 1000 AOBs. The report quotes that in patients 65 and over, Lanarkshire was one of 11 boards to</p>

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		<p>show a significant decrease when a comparison of the yearly rates between April 2008-March 2009 and April 2009-March 2010 was made.</p> <p>Our exact figures for the most recent quarter are 66 episodes (>65 years old) giving a rate of 0.56 cases > 65 years old / 1000 OCBs for the quarter up to March 2010 and an annual figure (up to Dec 09) of 0.60 cases > 65 years old / 1000 OCBs. This compares with an original HEAT target of 1.00 cases > 65 years old / 1000 OCBs or a revised target of 406 episodes (50% reduction) in the next 12 months.</p>
Task Force	Green	The organisation remains on track to deliver against the Task Force programme.
RAG Report	Green	<p>'Purple' - complete = 20</p> <p>'Green' - on track to complete by the deadline = 1</p>
Hand Hygiene	Green	The National Audit undertaken in May/June shows a drop in compliance from the previous compliance score of 94% to 90% which still meets the national target of 90%. The most notable reduction in compliance for this period was noted to be the medical staff group and communication was disseminated to key medical personnel to highlight this sustainability issue.
Surgical Site Infection (SSI)	Amber	<p>SSI surveillance rates April – June 2010:</p> <p>The figures shown have been produced by HPS in relation to the mandatory requirements of HDL (2006) 38 and CEL (11) 2009. April – June 2010 figures given are not representative of a complete quarter until all local and national data has been entered by 17 August 2010.</p> <p>Orthopaedic – NHSL 0.00%, National 0.92% (Elective – 0.00%, National – 0.56%, Emergency – 0.00% National – 0.99%).</p> <p>Caesarean Section – NHSL 3.38%,</p>

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		<p>National 3.15% (Elective – 3.08%, National 2.77%, Emergency – 3.60%, National 3.50%).</p> <p>Quarter 2 April – June 2010 shows Lanarkshire to be below the national rate for superficial and deep infections in Orthopaedics.</p> <p>For CS, Lanarkshire had a higher rate of superficial infections but below the national rate of deep infections. Caution is urged in these comparisons due to differing time frames and the fact that for CS, Lanarkshire collected a higher percentage of surveillance data than other Boards.</p>
<p>Cleaning Standards</p>	<p>Green</p>	<p>The NHSScotland National Cleaning Services Specification Quarterly Compliance Report for Quarter 1 - April - June 2010 is due to be published by Health Facilities Scotland (HFS) at the end of August 2010.</p> <p>Cleaning performance scores across all NHSL premises during April and May 2010 produced an average score of 96.2%. Of the 298 audits undertaken within the three acute hospitals, there were 2 areas that scored below 90%. These areas were re-monitored and scored above 90%. Of the 133 audits undertaken across CHP premises, 6 individual areas scored below 90%. Hotel Services Management ensured all shortfalls were rectified within 48 hours with appropriate actions undertaken to improve & maintain performance.</p> <p>As one of the 4 pilot boards, NHSL completed the pilot of the Estates Monitoring Tool between January – March 2010. The system is now live across all NHS Boards and all estates related scores will now be reported to HFS with the domestic cleaning scores. In relation to the introduction of HAI SCART, this continues to be work in progress & NHSL will continue to participate in both groups</p>
